Code of Conduct and Statement of Understanding

The success of Tschitani Lodge depends on the conduct of each individual Brother of the Lodge. As a Scout and an Arrowman, I understand and will observe all rules and regulations of the Connecticut Rivers Council, the Order of the Arrow, Scouting America, and will observe the reasonable demands made of me.

As a member of the Order of the Arrow, I will:

1. Observe the Scout Law, Scout Oath, and the Obligation of the Order of the Arrow.
2. Wear my officially designated uniform as required throughout the event, specifically all ceremonies, during Saturday evening supper, and during the chapel service/business meeting.
3. Be personally responsible for the breakage, damage, or loss of property.
4. Observe quiet hours. This includes staying in my assigned camp site/cabin from the designated time for lights out until the designated wake up time.
5. Keep my quarters clean and dispose of trash in the proper places.
6. Register and pay for all events that I attend.
7. Allow no unregistered person to occupy my quarters.
8. Shirts and shoes will be worn at all times in accordance with Scouting America policy.
9. No alcohol or illegal drugs will be allowed on camp property.
10. Not to leave camp or my assigned camp site/cabin without permission of the event adult leadership.
11. Remember that I am a guest of Tschitani Lodge, of Connecticut Rivers Council, and the camp where the event is being held.
12. Park only in designated areas unless approved. Designated areas include the activity field and the parking lot. See the adult leadership for other approved parking or driving while at camp.
13. Not drive another youth in a vehicle if I am under the age of 18.
14. Use the buddy system while in camp. Buddy pairs should not be more than 2 years apart in age and should be single gender.

These rules apply to all youth under the age of 21.

Scouting America prohibits the use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances at encampments or activities on property owned and/or operated by Scouting America, or at any activity involving participation of youth members. Adult leaders should support the attitude that young adults are better off without tobacco and may not allow the use of tobacco products at any BSA activity involving youth participants. All Scouting functions, meetings, and activities should be conducted on a smoke-free basis, with smoking areas located away from all participants. I understand that the failure to abide by these rules as approved by the Lodge could result in my removal from camp premises, the OA event, the OA lodge, and/or Scouting.
